



Biography: David Sturgill, SVU Section Chief, Utah County Attorney's Office

David Sturgill is a veteran prosecutor and legal educator with over 25 years of experience in Utah's criminal justice system. He currently serves as **Section Chief of the Special Victims Unit (SVU)** in the Utah County Attorney's Office, where he leads the prosecution of sexual and violent crimes against women and children. His prosecutorial experience also includes a broad range of criminal offenses, from homicides and domestic violence to fraud, property crimes, and drug-related offenses—many of which he has successfully taken to trial.

Sturgill began his legal career after graduating from the **J. Reuben Clark Law School at Brigham Young University** in 1997. He first served as a judicial clerk for Judge Ray Harding, Sr. of Utah's Fourth District Court, and then worked as a criminal defense attorney with the **Utah County Public Defenders Association** from 1998 to 2000. This early experience on the defense side provided him with a well-rounded perspective that continues to inform his work as a prosecutor.

In addition to his courtroom work, Sturgill is a certified member of the **Officer Involved Critical Incident Team** and holds a certification from **Force Science**, contributing to investigations of officer-involved shootings and other high-stakes incidents.

Sturgill is also deeply committed to legal education and public service. He serves as an **adjunct professor at Utah Valley University**, where he teaches law-related courses for the **UVU Police Academy**, helping to prepare the next generation of law enforcement professionals.
